Introduction

As many of you will know, All We Can is the relief and development charity of the Methodist Church, who do amazing work to tackle poverty and injustice globally by partnering with local organisations in low-income countries.

Each year, All We Can produce a number of resources that help churches like us engage with issues of global justice. These resources are tied together by a common theme, and All We Can are encouraging us to take 10mins towards the start of this year to introduce the concept behind their new campaign.

Activity

Before we show another video introducing this year's campaign, we're going to see on the screen a number of bible passages that talk about 'home' in some way. Take a look at those for a moment and then have a quick chat with those around you about what 'home' means to you. That might be a place, a feeling, a person, or something else entirely.





Display the slide in the PowerPoint, allow time for conversation, and invite feedback if appropriate.

Introducing the New Campaign

We'll now show a video which will explain why the concept of 'home' is going to be an important theme this year for All We Can.

The first chance we get to explore stories from Liberia is with All We Can's Lent resource, which this year is entitled 'What is Mine to Do?'. The idea is to use Lent as a time of reflection and discernment on what our role is as justice-seekers all year round, rather than an isolated period where we might do something as a one-off.

All of the Lent content is available digitally on the resources section of the All We Can website. This includes 6 postcards full of stories and suggestions, a set of 40 reflective questions for each of the 40 days, and a colouring sheet with 40 sections to complete over the course of Lent.

In the rest of 2024, we will have the opportunity to explore 'Charity Begins at Home' as a church in Refugee Week, at Harvest, and in Advent. Each of which will explore not only All We Can's work in Liberia, but also what it means for us as Christians in the UK to fruitfully work with our local communities. So keep an eye out for news about those.
