Your gift will be used to support our work fighting poverty and transforming lives, wherever the need is greatest.

This could include supporting impactful partners like Rural Human Rights Activists Programme (RHRAP) in Liberia.

RHRAP promote and protect fundamental human rights in Liberia through rule of law, human rights, democracy, and livelihood programmes. They work particularly with rural and mining communities, empowering them to improve their living conditions, tackle the root causes of poverty and inequality, and hold duty-bearers accountable.

Livelihood programmes enhance people's capacity to support themselves. This reduces crime, imprisonment and migration and helps to promote lasting peace.

Yusuf Manneh is a tailor, trained as part of RHRAP's vocational education whilst in prison. He is very passionate about his work and believes it keeps him busy and away from things he does not wish to be involved in. "What I want to see for the future, I just want to see myself as an instructor", he says. "I want to be teaching so that the legacy can continue to grow. That is my vision."
